Hello, I want to start by introducing myself, My name is Miriam Delgado Loera and I am the Food Coordinator for United Way of Morgan County. I help our community find resources when they are in need of Food, assistance with Rent, etc. I also run the Food Distribution in Brush on the 4th Wednesday of the month. As well as Senior Delivery at the Brush Methodist church every 3rd Friday of the month. We are very blessed that we have been able to manage our way to help distribute food with the volunteers that we have. We are seeking help from you or anyone you know that is looking for opportunities to help our community in need. We have been running into an issue of not having

enough volunteers in our past distributions which have been delaying our scheduled start time. We are fully run by volunteers who come and hep. Our distribution at Brush starts at 10 am and volunteers come in at 8am or 8:30 to help open the boxes of food and start separating the product which can be produce, frozen items, dry goods. We then start packing boxes by the amount of food that goes in each box. Once we have a good amount of boxes pre packed we will then start the distribution. We have a great number of senior citizens who can't lift the heavy boxes for which we will put the boxes in their cars. We usually will be done by 12, it really depends on how many volunteers we have. We also have the distribution at the Brush Methodist Church which is different in the sense that we deliver the boxes to their homes. As of right now we are only delivering to 10 seniors. We have been having to do that in between myself ad my co-worker. For this delivery we ask for a small group of 3 people with at least one or two cars so all the boxes fit. Each client gets 2 boxes. One of dry goods and the second of produce and or freezer and fridge goods. Please reach out to me if you have any questions or would like more information. Miriam Delgado: 970-370-3087

BETHLEHEM LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING APRIL 14, 2024

The meeting was brought to order by President Deb Johnson at 10:23am. Members present were Deb Johnson, Beth Hocheder, Maren Bostrom, Jeanette Dehning and Kim Redden, plus Deacon Ro. Absent members were Charlene Holzworth, Terry Linker and Isaac Linker.

Ro gave the opening prayer. Kim moved to approve the consensus agenda (minutes, treasurer report and Ro's report), Maren seconded the motion. Motion passed.

A big thank you to Kevin DeKorte and Jody for all their work on our technology. New parts are needed and permission was given for them to buy the needed parts. As the DeKorte's will be gone the month of May, Kim, Marissa, Sharon and Deb have all volunteered to help. It does take two people to do the task each Sunday.

There has been much discussion and research over the past couple months about wax, oil and battery candles. Beeswax candles would be the best wax candles, but they have a smell, and burn unevenly. Battery candles have a flame that is not seen well and would use a lot of batteries. So it was finally decided with Beth moving and Jeanette seconding, to keep the oil candles as they have no smell and stay the same height. The full candelabra will be used Easter through Pentecost, and Christmas through Epiphany.

Deb was given permission to buy nine bags to keep the Sterling Silver. Ro is still working on updating our constitution and bylaws we agreed upon. When completed it will be sent to the synod. After that the congregation will vote on the proposed changes.

Ro will be taking vacation May 24-30. Ro can be reached by phone during her vacation is there is a need. Dan Bolman has been requested to be the supply pastor that Sunday. On May 5th Ro will be doing the service at Immanuel in Greeley, and Monica Butler with UNC Campus Ministry will be conducting our service. And Ro has gotten a synod grant to pay for her synod assembly expenses.

Several events will be upcoming. Lane Morrow will have a reaffirmation of faith on April 28th. Kim will be making a cake for him for Come and Celebrate that day. Ro will incorporate Ladies (Mother's) Day and Men's (Father's) Day into her sermons.

Ro requested the second Sunday of June, July and August to have a "grill" night. Ro will be grilling hamburgers and/or hot dogs with potato salad available. Others may bring a side but do not have to do so. This will happen with the meal 5-5:45, with a game/social time 5:45-6:30pm.

Deb will check with Larry Mills to see if he is still willing to do our church lawn care. The sprinklers do need to be turned on soon to get the grass watered. The system does need some repairs done on it. No word has come from the roof repair company. A local contractor will be contacted to do the needed repairs upstairs to repair the water damage.
