This month we had the gift of fresh flowers on our altar three Sundays running, going for the fourth Sunday by refrigerating them all week. We invite any and all of you who might like to bring flowers to the church, please do. No sign-up necessary, no deliveries to the church, bring from your gardens or a

shopping trip. We have plenty of vases and will provide a vase when you bring flowers with you on Sunday. Then, we will refrigerate them during the week to see just how many Sundays God's garden beauties can be enjoyed!

Betty (Lage) Kelly re-affirms her membership with us Oct 29, Reformation Sunday; Bethlehem, her place she always considered home with baptism, confirmation, and marriage all taking place right here. Welcome home Betty! A suggestion from our home visitation members that Holy Communion be offered every Sunday just in case they are able to come to church. ## ALL SAINTS' DAY


This is a special Sunday where we celebrate all the saints, both known and unknown, who have gone before us and now reside in Heaven with our beloved Lord and Savior.

please list them on the paper on the shelf in the church entryway or let the church office know.








It is indeed the most wonderful time of the year! Come join your Bethlehem family in setting up the Chrismon tree and preparing the church building for the season of Advent.




