Lent has arrived! Last Wednesday, February 14, forty-three gathered in-person to share in the Imposition of Ashes and reflection around searching/ seeking the heart of God's character. In our patience of affliction with internet connection outage, Spectrum has provided a new modem, router, connector, and labor at no cost. This week Excel is changing all our light bulbs throughout the building to LED at no cost to us, providing better lighting in all areas, including our afflicted dark areas. Our Altar Guild has received five new banners given to us by Our Savior's in Greeley. The Guild learned how our existing banners can be better used and displayed with our church seasons and scriptures, an affliction from not-knowing. Plus, they will begin using the glass cups again at communion. Clean-up will be eased by new dishwasher trays for communion cups, a Larry Redden Memorial Gift. These glass communion cups ease the affliction of plastic cups breaking in the communion trays and allow us to be environmental stewards.

It is Lent! In hope, patience, and faithfulness we overcome affliction, we live in love for each other and for our Creator, and we experience joy!!! Thanks be to God, the One watching over us. Thanks be to Jesus Christ, the One who shows us the Way. Thanks be to the Spirit, the One who opens our hearts, minds, and spirits to something greater!





CAMP SUNDAY HAS BEEN RESCHEDULED!


On Sunday **March 10** we will be having Camp Sunday. Pr. Bekah Boatwright, Program Director for Sky Ranch, will be here for a special worship service.

BETHLEHEM LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING FEBRUARY 11, 2024

The meeting was brought to order at 10:19am by President Deb Johnson. Members present were Deb Johnson, Maren Bostrom, Beth Hocheder, Terry Linker, Kim Redden, Isaac Linker and Jeanette Dehning. Deacon Ro gave the opening prayer.

After a correction was made to last month's minutes with the Freshen Up monies being \$4,659.83, Jeanette moved, Maren seconded, and the motion to accept the Consensus Agenda was passed.

OLD BUSINESS: *Lent* begins February 14, with a 5:30pm service at Bethlehem. Sunday services will be held in the respective churches. The Wednesday soup luncheons and Bible studies, and Holy Week night 5:30 services will be held in different churches. Check your Bethlehem calendar to see where to go. Ro will be calling those on our inactive list to invite them to the Lenten opportunities.

NEW BUSINESS: *New council officers* were reminded they need to go to the bank to give information so they can be available to sign checks when needed.

The *Roll List* was reviewed, with a few more changes being made. Jeanette moved to accept these lists, Beth seconded, and the motion passed.

Lay Preacher Training is being offered for those wishing to do lay preaching. Training includes how to write and give sermons, as well as many other bits of information. Charlene has volunteered to do this. Jeanette moved and Kim seconded for BLC to cover the cost of the training and book. Motion passed.

A *church council work session* will be held for two hours February 25. We will continue our work on the constitution. Please review all the committees in the constitution and their usefulness.

OTHER BUSINESS: The last Prairie Parish meeting had over 40 people attend.

Beth requested to do her church financial business on her own computer. It has all the programs she needs and is familiar with to do this. Kim moved and Terry seconded for her to be able to do this. Motion passed.

Randy Meza requested the last of his payment for the cement work he is doing. He is planning to do some of the work at his own expense. Deb will get a check to him by Tuesday afternoon.

A long discussion was held about *banking*. Should we use only one instead of two Brush banks? If we go to one bank, which one shall we use? Some people have their tithing directly deposited into a bank. As the financial people, Kim and Beth, plus Deb, will make the final decision on this. As our checking account was low on funds, Jeanette moved and Maren seconded to move \$20,000 from our savings account to our checking.

A *fire inspector* was in our building last week. Everything looked good except he would like to see a fire extinguisher closer to the back door.

A gift of a sterling silver tea set was accepted.

Kim will be March Deacon, and Beth usher.


