#### Bethlehem Lutheran Congregational Council Meeting January 11, 2024

The January Church Council meeting was called to order at 6:40 pm on January 11, 2024. Members present were Deb Johnson, Kim Redden, Beth Hocheder, Isaac Linker, Terry Linker, Maren Bostrom, Jeanette Dehning, Chaplain Ro, and Marsha Mills via Zoom.

Absent was Charlene Holzworth.

Ro gave the opening prayer. Consensus agenda (Minutes, Treasurer's report, Ro's report) was moved to be accepted by Kim and seconded by Beth, and the motion passed. Ro added several events to her report. Ro stated she has two funerals next week, neither of which are members of Bethlehem. This is part of Bethlehem's outreach into the community. And if she is called upon for pastoral duty she will be there. She stated that some months are just busier than others, and December was a busy month.

Correspondence: ELCA sent a thank you for the \$976.50 for World Hunger from our chili supper. We also received a thank you from Esther Wyatt for remembering her at Christmas. Our Rocky Mountain Synod let us know that there was a 12.5% overall decline in mission support. We gave what we said we would in 2023, so Deb moved and Jeanette seconded to not give more.

Old Business: The membership roll review is going very well. Half of those who attended church the 6th stayed to help go through the rolls. Five people were removed from the rolls as requested. Those who have not communed or given in the past year are being listed as "Inactive". Anyone who has given or communed in the past year is listed as "Active." It is hoped this task will be finished after church on January 28th.

The Faith Journey classes have only had one person sign up, and one maybe. We have until January 20 to sign up. One past council member signed up for the Four Gospel class. It will be held the third Saturday of each month, beginning January 20, from 9-11am.

The copier has broken down and will be replaced by the company. Of the two printers, the Brother does not print well, and the other needs ink.

The annual meeting will be held January 21 after church. The new council president will conduct the meeting. Terresa and Deb have been working on the agenda. Terresa is waiting for a couple more reports before printing the annual meeting booklet.

New Business: The bid proposal from Randy Meza was handed out. Both Terry and Jeanette brought up the fact that when they had concrete work done their contractor had the price of the cement in their contract, but they were later billed for the cement from the seller. Deb moved and Maren seconded to have Randy do the sidewalk in front of Bethlehem at a weather appropriate time. The motion passed. We will pay for the materials at the businesses and not as part of the contract. We agreed to use the remaining Freshen Up monies (\$459.83) for this project, then close out that account.

Council meetings have been moved from the second Thursday evening of the month, to the second Sunday of the month right after church. Terry moved and Beth seconded for this to begin in February 2024. The motion passed. It was requested that the meetings end by 12 noon.

Nominations were then made for 2024 council officers. Jeanette moved and Terry seconded for Deb Johnson to be our new president. Motion passed. Jeanette moved and Kim seconded for (continued on page 5)

seconded for Terry Linker be the new Vice-President. Motion passed. Terry moved and both Isaac and Maren seconded for Jeanette to be the new secretary. Motion passed. Beth moved and Maren seconded for Kim to continue as Treasurer. Motion passed. Jeanette moved and Isaac seconded for Beth to be the new Financial Secretary. Motion passed.

Other Business: At last Sunday's service Ro gave each person a Star Gift. On it was their word for the year. Next Tuesday's Ministerial Alliance will discuss Lent rotation with the Methodists, Presbyterians and BLC. They may begin February 11 so each church has two Sundays. We may do Ash Wednesday as the others do Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. January 21st will be installation of new council members during the church service, followed by the Annual Meeting. January 28th the council will continue reviewing the constitution. Lent begins February 14.

Pat Chase has asked to do a New Ministry program, possibly called Compassionate Heart Outreach. This will include things such as a buddy program for some of our older/single people, a giving tree all year long, food relief two Sundays per month the even numbered months and other such things.

A Sky Ranch pastor is to be here this Sunday. Due to the extreme cold, how many people will attend? Should we reschedule to a Sunday later in the year when more people would be likely to attend? Deb moved and Isaac seconded to reschedule Sky Ranch, and to cancel church for this Sunday. Both emails and phone calls will be made so we don't miss anyone.

The Lord's Prayer was recited, with the meeting adjourned at 8:12pm.
